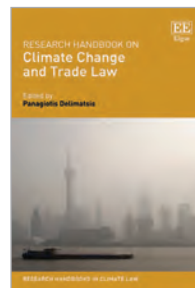

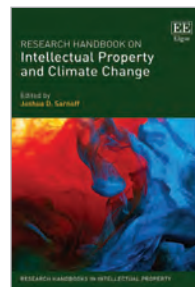

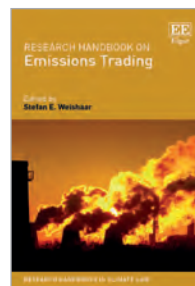

Business, Organised Labour and Climate Policy targets the lack of effective action in bridging the gap between climate change goals and governmental policies. With little published about the role of employers' organisations and trade unions in the climate change policy process, this book evaluates this and argues that labour market considerations should be an element of climate change policy.

This impartial study reviews the potential for a theoretical framework of ecological modernisation to guide policy development and the negotiation process. It finds that civil society actors are effective advocates, and while employers organisations and trade unions are effective contributors to the civil society advocacy, climate change was not generally part of their policy nor were they prioritising it. Included are case studies of climate change policy in six developed and two developing economies, as well as within organisations such as the European Union and the UNFCCC. The emergence of labour issues in formal climate agreements reflects the impact that climate change is having on the broader economy and employment.
